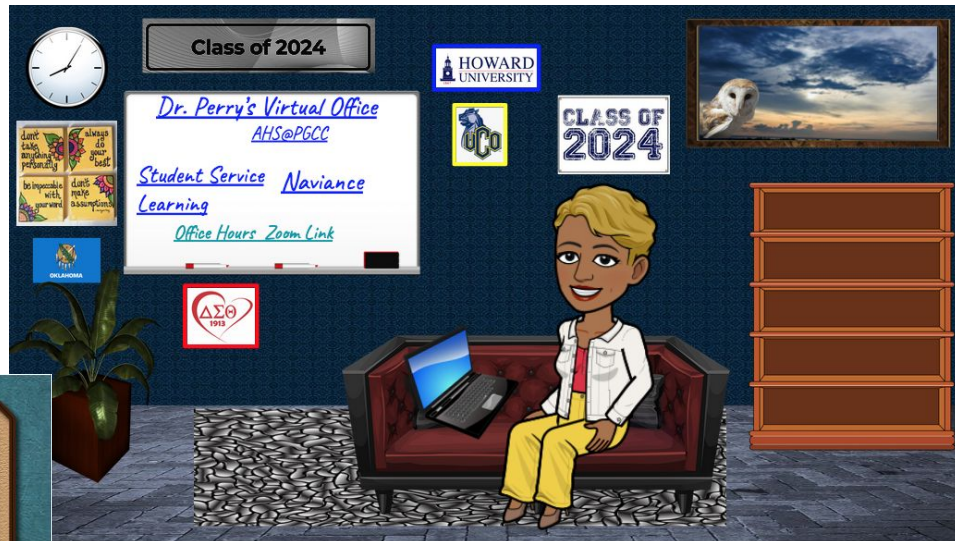

Solution Focused Brief Counseling

Solution focused brief therapy (SFBT) targets the desired outcome of therapy as a solution rather than focusing on the problem, symptoms, or issues that brought someone to your office.

This technique only gives attention to the present and the future desires of the student, rather than focusing on the past experiences.

The counselor encourages the student to imagine their future as they want it to be and then the counselor and student collaborate on a series of steps to achieve that goal.

This form of talk therapy involves reviewing and dissecting the student's vision (detailing what has worked), and determining what skills, resources, and abilities the student will develop and use to attain the desired outcome.
