We will be returning to 100% students in the physical school building. Seabrook Elementary will operate during our regularly scheduled hours, from 9:00 am to 3:15 pm. (Monday through Friday)

<u>UNIFORMS</u>: Since before 2009, Seabrook Elementary School has been an approved **Mandatory Uniform School** by the Prince George's County School Board of Education. **All students** are required to wear uniforms.

Mask Policy Update:

In light of the highly contagious COVID-19 BA.5 variant, Prince George's County Public Schools (PGCPS) will return to a mandatory mask policy in all schools and facilities until further notice, effective Monday, August 15. This decision was recommended by the Prince George's County Health Department.

When responding to public health threats such as COVID-19, Maryland school districts have flexibility in determining mask-wearing policies. In July, PGCPS transitioned from mandatory mask-wearing to a mask-optional policy for the first time since the onset of the pandemic.

Mask policy is subject to change according to local and/or state health department guidance and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommendations.

<u>IMMUNIZATIONS:</u> To help you prepare with ensuring that your child is properly immunized, Prince George's County Public Schools is offering **free** immunization clinics for students. **Remember, No Shots, No School!** Make an appointment for routine immunizations today! Kindergarteners in the State of Maryland are **required** to get a second dose of the chickenpox vaccine.

New: Free August Immunization Clinics!

PGCPS will host free immunization clinics from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the sites below to assist families with meeting immunization requirements. Families must register online for an appointment. These services are offered in collaboration with the Prince George's County Health Department and the Maryland Partnership for Prevention.

School Bus Transportation Reminders



To secure school bus transportation for the start of the 2022-23 school year, your student should have been registered for school by Wednesday, August 10th.

Elementary school students residing one and one-half miles or more from their assigned school, and middle school and high school students residing two miles or more from their assigned school are eligible for transportation.

Student Log-in Information

For students to access anything on the PGCPS domain, they will need their username and password. Returning students' information is the same as last year. For new Seabrook students who attended another Prince George's County Public School last year, they can reuse the same username and passwords from the previous school. For students new to PGCPS, they will receive their username and password at school.

Safe Internet Use

It is important that students who are using PGCPS issued devices use their devices for instructional purposes only. While students are learning online, we want to continue to protect them by encouraging a safe and secure learning environment. It is also important to make sure that students are making choices that align with the expectations and policies included in the Student Rights and Responsibilities Handbook. Hapara, similar to Go Guardian for Teachers, is a classroom management solution that allows teachers to send documents, communicate and monitor students' online activity. Parents will be contacted for their support if it is brought to the administration's attention that students are accessing sites other than the teaching ones intended for student use.

Student Attendance (all students)

Teachers will take attendance at the beginning of each day in SchoolMAX. If your child is absent, please provide the teacher an absence note. If your child is absent for 3 consecutive days, a doctor's note is required.

For students to receive make up assignments, their parents need to provide an absence note documenting their excused absence.

Early Dismissal

All students leaving class before the school day ends fall in the category of early dismissal. Being dismissed early from school often will affect a student's attendance. Early dismissal is anytime a student leaves the learning experience before 3:10 pm. Following these guidelines will help us to reduce classroom disruptions during instructional times.

Our "Early Dismissal" procedures are only in place for students who have doctor/dental appointments or family emergencies, which prevent the student from completing the entire school day. Instruction is ongoing from 9:00 am to 3:15 pm. We don't want your student to miss any vital information. Please keep this in mind when scheduling appointments. Your student's education is always our top priority.

Grades/Progress Reports & Report Cards

Students will receive letter or numerical grades on specific assignments according to the grading policy. Teachers may collect student work via a variety of resources. It is important that students turn in all their assignments in order to be successful in each subject area. Teachers will collect a minimum of two grades per week for elementary depending on the number of meetings/periods that occurred that week.

During the 2022-2023 school year, progress report grades and report card grades will be available in SchoolMAX after every marking period. Students will be able to log into SchoolMAX to view their grades at any time throughout the school year. Parents can also receive an account to access their child's grades on the SchoolMAX family portal.

SchoolMAX Family Portal

As you are aware, the school system implemented the SchoolMAX Family Portal. This system provides a method for families to access their children's attendance, grades, family information, and discipline incidences twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. Please make sure that you take advantage of this system that will allow you to constantly monitor your children's progress in school. If you have not received your unique access key for the Family Portal, please email any of the following staff members for assistance: Mr. Jose Riggins, Parent Engagement Assistance, Ms. Ebonie Hawkins, Professional School Counselor. Mrs. Jena Pena, Secretary 1 and Mrs. Cynthia Sykes, Business Accounting Technician. The SchoolMAX system is now open to parents for this school year. You may edit and update your phone numbers and home address information if needed. We encourage all parents to ensure their contact

information in SchoolMAX is correct. If the data is incorrect in the system, you will not receive the necessary updates or be able to access student passwords for the upcoming school year.

Please be aware that if changes are made in SchoolMAX, parents will have to provide proof/evidence of residency through the PGCPS online registration process. We look forward to providing weekly updates for the upcoming school year in order to keep everyone informed.

Cell Phones / Electronics/Toys

We are requesting that students do not use their cell phones during instruction. Cell phones must be turned off and put away during the school day. All other electronics, game systems and toys are not permitted to be used during learning time. The Seabrook staff cannot be responsible for lost or damage cell phones neither other personal items. Students bring these items to school at their own risks.

Communication with Parents

While we encourage parents to talk with teachers about their children's progress throughout the school year, teachers cannot be interrupted during the instructional day. If you need to speak with your children's teacher(s), please email them and they will call you at their earliest convenience, within 48 hours. If you are unable to reach the teacher within the 48 hours or it is an emergency, call the school and the secretary will take a message to relay to the teacher.

Visitors to the School Building

Per Prince George's County Public Schools Safety Policy, all visitors must present a photo identification to enter the school building. Identification cards will be scanned through the school's security system and upon successful clearance, a visitor's pass will be issued. Prince George's County is requiring that all visitors must be scanned through the security system to ensure safety throughout the *school year*. Due to COVID-19 the following measures are also being taken for all visitors entering our school building:

- Call the school and make an appointment to ensure that staff are in the building and can provide the assistance you need the day you plan to come see us.
- If you are not feeling well, we ask that you not enter the school building and visit us another day. Contact your health care provider and get the support you need right away.
- Currently, PGCPS has required that all visitors and employees must wear a mask when entering the school building for safety reasons.
- Please practice social distancing by maintaining 3 feet or more distance from others.
- · Avoid shaking hands.
- Cover your mouth when you are coughing or sneezing.
