Reading Nook


From Melissa Whaley (3rd Grade Teacher) Primary read -


Corduroy by Don Freeman

Math Minute

Did you know that research indicates that students who know their basic facts are able to perform math tasks at a greater rate of proficiency and speed? The best Math gift your child can give themselves is memorizing basic facts.

Try focusing on one fact a day, for example, 18-9=9. Throughout the day (when they wake up, in the car, at meal time, before bed) quiz your child on just that fact. Because you have isolated just that fact, they are more likely to store that fact into long-term memory. We have 3 second graders and 3 fifth graders who have memorized their basic facts through weekly timed test given to them by their teacher.
