Reading Nook


Primary read -


The Ugly Pumpkin by Dave Horowitz. A book that takes us from Halloween to Thanksgiving as we follow an ugly pumpkin that no one wants until he finds who he truly is and where he really belongs.

Intermediate -

Chester Nez and the Unbreakable Code: A Navajo Code Talker's Story, by Joseph Bruchac. The biography of World War II code talker Chester Nez. As a child Chester is forced to go to boarding school where he is forbidden to speak Navajo or practice his native traditions. During WWII he and others use the Navajo language to write and use a code that helps to win the war in the Pacific. November is Native American Heritage Month. Along with sharing part of the history of the US government's relationship with native peoples, this book provides an opening for discussing the importance of identity and community.

Home Expectations

Every grade has different policies and expectations for homework. There are a few commonalities across all grades, however.

Reading

Nothing is more important for children than reading at home. Set up a schedule for the whole family to read independently, parent to child, and child to parent.

DreamBox

DreamBox is a PGCPS mandated math intervention program. It is an adaptive program that tailors itself to individual student needs. Teachers can also assign lessons. All students should complete a set number of lessons (check with your teacher) a week.

iReady

iReady is the PGCPS mandated reading intervention program for all K-5 students. Students should spend a minimum of 45 minutes a week on iReady (we often recommend more). In addition to supporting students, iReady also provides teacher with important diagnostic information.

Early Dismissal

All early dismissals must occur prior to 2:30pm. Please notify the teacher ahead of time and call the office when you arrive at school (or 5 minutes prior).



Please notify teachers in writing of changes to transportation home by noon (preferably earlier). If you do not get a response form the teacher, please call the main office. Please try to keep your child's transportation as consistent as possible for safety.
